Suspension of Work in the District of Columbia

Observance of Christmas Day and New Year's Day Tuesday, December 24 through Wednesday, December 25, 2024 Tuesday, December 31 through Wednesday, January 1, 2025

In observance of Christmas Day and New Year's Day, and pursuant to section 103.01 Article 17 item C of the District's Standard Specifications for Highways and Structures, there will be a suspension of work in the District from 12 p.m., Tuesday, December 24 through Wednesday, December 25, 2024, and from 12 p.m., Tuesday, December 31 through Wednesday, January 1, 2025. Lane closures and work zones will not be allowed for non-emergency work in roadways, alleys and sidewalks within the District's right of way. This includes manhole access and construction-related deliveries.

Approved activities may resume Thursday, December 26, 2024, and Thursday, January 2, 2025, respectively during permitted work hours.

Per the District Department of Transportation (DDOT)'s standard practice, there will be **NO** authorized exemptions allowed during this suspension of work.
