Temporary Suspension of Work for Special Event
DC Open Streets
Saturday, October 5, 2024

In observance of the Districts Open Streets event and pursuant to section 103.01 Article 17 item C of the District's Standard Specifications for Highways and Structures, there will be scheduled road closures and a temporary suspension of construction work along the following corridor within Ward 1:

7th Street NW (E Street NW and Rhode Island Avenue NW)

Approved public space activities may resume Monday, October 7, 2024
during permitted working hours

Lane closures and work zones will not be allowed for non-emergency work in roadways, alleys and sidewalks within the District's right of way of this immediate area. This includes manhole access and construction-related deliveries. All construction staging areas/materials/equipment occupying the sidewalks/curb lanes are required to be removed no later than Friday, October 4, 2024, if applicable, and replaced during permitted working hours.

During this time, there will be **NO exemptions** throughout this temporary suspension of work within this designated area.
