## DDOT Suspends Placement of ENP/RP Signs on Behalf of Out-of-Town Customers

(Washington, DC) - The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) today announced that its staff will no longer post Emergency Parking/Reserved Parking (ENP/RP) signs on behalf of out-of-town customers, effective immediately. This service was provided as a courtesy to incoming residents who needed ENP/RP signs to reserve parking for moving trucks during their relocation into the District of Columbia.

Unfortunately, due to budgetary constraints, DDOT can no longer offer this courtesy service. Customers located outside the District of Columbia who require ENP/RP signs must arrange for a local contact or a contractor to post the required signage on their behalf. It should be noted that parking enforcement by the Department of Public Works depends on proper and timely signposting.

Public space permit approvals will continue to be issued as appropriate.
