DDOT Updates Traffic Control Plan Requirements for Construction Permits

Washington, DC – The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) has updated its requirements for construction permit applications within its <u>Transportation Online Permitting System (TOPS)</u>. Applicants and permittees will no longer be required to upload Traffic Control Plan (TCP) documentation when applying for Construction permits.

Occupancy Permit applicants will still need to upload TCPs when applying for those permits. The TCP is required to be officially stamped by a Professional Engineer. This Construction permit update will continue to streamline the public space permit applications, helping to simplify the process.
